Culture Questions

Question: Do most FSU students study during the summer?

Answer: Many FSU students do study during summer semester, but there are fewer students here on campus during the summer.

A lot of FSU students graduate at the end of spring semester in April or May, but most new students don't start FSU until fall semester in August. As a result, there are fewer students around during the summer. Also, many FSU students will return home during the summer or use the time to study in another country or do an **internship**. Even though there are still a large number of undergraduate classes being offered, there are very few graduate school classes offered. Language Question

*Question: Are the words **media** and **data** singular or plural?*

A: **Both**. Technically speaking, *media* and *data* are both (irregular) plural count nouns. These words are derived from Latin. The singular form of *media* is *medium* (noun) and the singular form of *data* is *datum*. However, many native English speakers do not realize these words are plural, so you may often hear and even read these words being used as non-count (singular) words.

Correct: The data show that most people don't want to pay for a parking decal.

Commonly used, but technically incorrect: The data shows that most people don't want to pay for a parking decal.
